 A search for the surname of ORLANDO within the Army produced 95 results
 covering a variety of years, First and Second World Wars and others, for
 example 1951 and 1981. Also recorded are military promotions (to see an
 example search within the Army and the surname of VIRCIGLIO).
- Honours of the Presidency of the Republic <u>https://www.quirinale.it/Onorificenze</u>
 - This site indicates that the range is from 1793, but the actual date ranges are 1975 to-date. A search for VIRCIGLIO produced 6 results, ranging from 1970 – 2021, along with information on the honours awarded.
 - It was decided that in 1968 those who had served in the First World War and were still alive were able to request their honour to the Ministry of Defence, via their town of residence. A copy of the original diploma is possible, but only to the spouse or son of the awarded. You can email <u>r3rion.segreteria@persomil.difesa.it</u>

 - Navy personnel up to 1900 are with those related to Army personal and can be found in the State Archives.


